HAP in 2021

Despite the pandemic...

- Received 6 grants – 2 from the Greater Washington Community Foundation, 3 from the City of Hyattsville, and 1 from the Anacostia Trails Heritage Area
- Created 2 new programs and got involved with food security
- Began collaborations with many other organizations, including Meals on Wheels, area food pantries, Central Kenilworth Avenue Revitalization CDC, Friendship Arms, and sister villages in University Park and College Park
