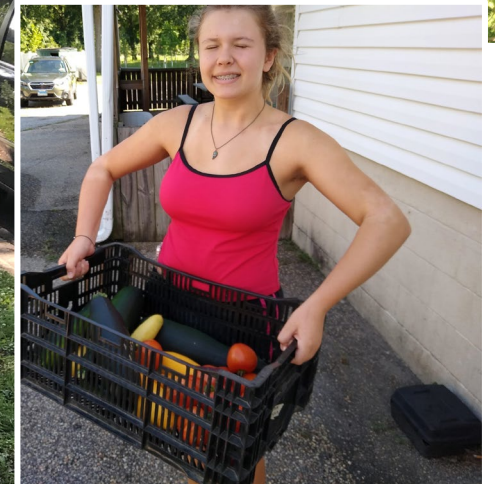
What Is HAP?

- A volunteer-run nonprofit village dedicated to helping Hyattsville residents stay in their homes and remain active as they age in our community.
- Founded in 2011; a 501(c)(3)

- Funded through yearly membership dues of \$35, individual and business contributions, and grants.
